IPL

A photo-rejuvenation laser process that can correct a variety of skin conditions, such as facial skin imperfections due to sun damage, signs of photo-aging, and other blemishes. After several treatments you can see a significant reduction in unwanted pigmentation.

Fraxel

A Fraxel treatment targets thousands of microscopic areas of skin, using pinpoint laser beams that penetrate beneath the skin's surface to eliminate old, damaged skin cells. The process stimulates the body's natural healing process which replaces damaged skin with fresh, glowing skin

Derm Notes

Actinic Keratosis

Actinic keratoses (AKs), often called “pre-cancers,” are a result of sun damage. They are commonly seen among fair individuals on sun-exposed skin such as the face, hands, bald scalp and legs. A typical actinic keratosis is a dry, scaly bump or patch of skin that is pink or light brown in color. Often they are easier to feel than see. It is important to have any suspicious non-healing area evaluated by a medical professional.

If left untreated, AKs have the potential to develop into skin cancer. Up to 60% of squamous cell carcinomas began as an actinic keratosis. Various treatment methods are effective, including cryotherapy, surgical removal, and creams such as Carac, Aldara, and Solaraze. Regular use of sunscreen and sun protective clothing can greatly reduce the risk for developing actinic keratosis, even in sun damaged skin.
